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COURSE DESCRIPTION

The seminar on Academic Research and Writing introduces students to the basic issues of scientific work, clarification on the fundamentals of the philosophy of science, and teaches selected competencies in the methods of empirical research. The seminar is intended to enable students to apply the acquired knowledge to the preparation of their seminar papers as well as their master thesis.

The seminar will introduce students to the following topics:

- To learn about scientific work and writing.
- To comprehend the importance of the philosophy of science.
- To understand the essential basic scientific theory terms and concepts.
- To plan research proposals.

COURSE DESIGN AND ASSIGNMENTS

In addition to teaching the theoretical basics, students will present reference software tools in order to learn how to manage and organize their referencing when writing seminar papers and their thesis. Moreover, students will submit a research proposal on a selected topic as a final assessment.
